| Abstract:       | The <i>Look</i> Magazine Glens Falls "Hometown U.S.A." Photograph<br>Collection contains over 5,000 photographs, mostly black and white<br>prints, but including 359 color slides. These photographs provide a<br>detailed portrait of the Glens Falls area in 1943-1944 during World<br>War II, showing people, streets, buildings, schools, churches,<br>industries, restaurants, hospital, recreation, parades, servicemen,<br>and various wartime activities. While the emphasis clearly is on<br>Glens Falls, some photographs of Queensbury, Lake George, and<br>other surrounding communities are also included. |

# HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

*Look* Magazine published a series of six articles in 1944, entitled "Hometown U.S.A.", designed to present Glens Falls as a patriotic model of the home front during World War II, particularly looking forward to America's transition from war to peace. The specific dates of the articles were April 4 and 18, June 27, and September 5 and 19, 1944. *Look* anticipated that these articles would provide other communities with ideas to stimulate their own postwar planning. The author of the series of articles was George F. Koether, associate editor of *Look*.

*Look* sent a team of photographers to Glens Falls for several months in 1943 and 1944 in preparation for these articles. The principal photographers were Harold Rhodenbaugh and Betty Truxell, and a person identified only as Sandberg also took a few photographs.

Two stories about the *Look* Magazine Glens Falls "Hometown U.S.A." photographs have been published by Don A. Metivier and may provide helpful background information; "How 'Hometown' happened," in his book *Saturday Morning* (Glens Falls, NY: *The Post-Star*, 1987), pp. 175-178; and "Wings/Glens/Glenn's Hometown Falls," in *Metivier On Saratoga, Glens Falls, Lake George, & the Adirondacks* (Champaign, IL: Sagamore Publishing Co., 1993), pp. 149-152. According to Metivier, the selection of Glens Falls as the site for the series of essays on a typical American town may have been the result of *Look's* need for color film, which was in short supply. To obtain film *Look* editors applied to the War Department for help. When the War Department provided the film, a grateful *Look* may well have chosen Glens Falls for the project because the city was the boyhood home of Secretary of War Robert Patterson.

# SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

The *Look* Magazine Glens Falls "Hometown U.S.A." Photograph Collection contains over 5,000 photographs, providing a detailed community portrait of the Glens Falls area, showing people, streets, buildings, schools, churches, industries, restaurants, hospital, recreation, parades, servicemen, and various wartime activities. While the emphasis clearly is on Glens Falls, some photographs of Queensbury, Lake George, and other surrounding communities are also included.

Most of the more than 5,000 images are small black and white prints, 2½ inches square in size, probably contact prints. A small number of prints are of larger size. No negatives were included with the collection, but some negatives have been prepared from prints in the collection. 359 color slides are also included. The photographs have been placed in twenty loose-leaf albums.

Also included is a slide show and script, prepared by Don Metivier and Bruce Cole from the color slides. Additional material in the collection includes copies of the six articles published in *Look*, identification sheets for some of the photographs, and enlargements of a few of the photographs prepared by Crandall Library for its exhibits.

# **ORGANIZATION OF THE RECORDS**

Photographs are arranged by an alphanumeric identification system. For the eighteen albums of black and white prints the identifications correspond to the general topic of the photographs (examples, M for Industry, P for Recreation, and S for Street Scenes). Within each category the photographs are listed numerically. An inventory is available for the prints, and approximately half of them are identified. Slides are in additional albums and have been assigned an identification number without regard for topic. Most of the slides have been identified. An inventory of the slides in the Metivier/Cole slide show is also available.

Articles published in *Look*, photographs for exhibits, negatives, identification sheets, and related material are in the five boxes.

Slides for the slide shows are in the three carousel trays.
