To Our Community,

The library world is full of jargon. To me, to *renew*, immediately brings to mind checking out a book again—extending the loan period—but more impactful is Webster's primary definition of renew, "1: to make like new: restore to freshness, vigor, or perfection." In 2022, we were able to safely lift COVID-19 pandemic restrictions on masking, social distancing, and wall-to-wall sanitization. Library access was restored with the return of our well-loved Children's indoor programming, exhibits featuring a wide variety of art in our two galleries, our long-running Film Series, and our Folklife Center reprised its musical series in September. The return of physical normalcy did not diminish demands on our burgeoning virtual collections and experiences. Electronic material use grew, and access to virtual author talks and Folklife programming flourished.

During the Pandemic Years, many of our dedicated staff and some of our most familiar faces retired or left the area in their own desire for renewal. As they reacquainted themselves with their families, we spent late 2021 and 2022 finding new staff to serve you and join (paraphrasing the Bard), "...our few, our happy few, our band of siblings."

Our 2022-2027 Long Range Plan launched with a variety of initiatives that met its goals including programming featuring the internationally known Mr. George Takei and the purchase in late 2022 of a Library Van to bring the Library to our patrons. We are eager to continue to bring you programs and services to educate, enrich and encourage our thriving community.

Thank you for your ongoing support as we renewed our programs and services.



New at Crandall


