SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

This single volume is a Bible containing family information on the Fish, Ballou, and Mowry families of particular interest to genealogist and social historians: *Holy Bible*. Philadelphia: William W. Harding, 1868. The family Bible of Thomas Fish (1799-1875) and his son Augustus Fish (1829-1905) contains listings of births, deaths, and marriages for the family of Thomas Fish (1799-1875), Lavina Ballou Fish (1804-1889), and many of their descendants. Photographs of several members of the Fish family are included in one section of the Bible. Typed genealogies of Williams and Mowry families, both related to the Ballou family, are pasted into the endpapers. Mabel Lavina Fish Swan (b. 1874), daughter of Augustus Fish and donor of this Bible, lived in Glens Falls.
