BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Charles Garlen (1898-1992) emigrated with his family from Bialystock, Russia in 1906 to escape persecution directed against Jews. He and his family moved to Glens Falls in 1911. He owned and operated Queen City Bakery in Glens Falls from 1927 to 1967. He was involved in numerous charitable and civic activities.

Max Tupper assembled this album of tribute to his friend Charles Garlen in 1993. The album contains copies of newspaper clippings, letters and other documents, dated from 1979-1992, describing the life, career, and charitable and civic activities of Charles Garlen.
