BIOGRAPHICAL/ HISTORICAL SKETCH

The Jacobson family descends from Julius Jacobson and his wife, Rosa Weinstein. Their children include Jessica Jacobson Boss, Pauline Jacobson Newberger, and Byron J. Jacobson. Jessica was born on October 1884 in Corry, Erie County, PA. She died in Glens Falls, New York on April 13, 1968. Byron J. Jacobson, a Glens Falls businessman, died at age 76 on April 2, 1957. Nathan J. Newberger (d. 1985?), son of Pauline, was an attorney in Washington, D.C.

SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

The Jacobson Family Collection contains photographs (some from the late 19th century), newspaper clippings and memorabilia of the Jacobson family, especially Julius and Rosa Jacobson, Jessica Boss, and Byron J. Jacobson. Included is a Remembrance Book of Jessica J. Boss, April 18, 1968.
