### SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

One privately published volume, this is copy number 69 of 104. The book contains color photographs attached to pages of the volume. The book is divided into two parts. The first part is by Carolyn Schaefer and describes several climbs in the Adirondack 46s, highest peaks in the Adirondacks. The chapter titles are: Gothics; Phelps; Whiteface; Dix; Sawteeth; Calamity Lean-Tos and Shepherd's Tooth; Gray Peak, Tabletop, Street and Nye; After Skylight; Santononi; Rondeau's, Sowards and Couchie; Allen and the Dixes; Snakes; and Afterward (by Evelyn Schaefer Greene). Part Two (pages 74-142) consists of stories of climbs in the Adirondacks written by Carolyn Schaefer and others from 1956 to 1989. Finally, there is a page written by Rosanne Fry outlining the steps in binding this book. This page is separate from the book and serves as supplemental material to it.
