Though this company is not producing the variety of dolls and kits that they had in the past, the Raggedy Ann and Andy, and Alice in Wonderland dolls are contemporary examples of what the company once produced locally for trade. These dolls were featured in the exhibition, *If Only They Could Talk: Dolls, Stories, & the Spirit of Dollmaking*, October-December 2000, guest curated by Nancy Scheemaker for the Folklife Center at Crandall Public Library.
