The scrapbooks also provide some general background on World War I and support of the war effort in the Glens Falls region.

SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

The Red Cross Scrapbooks contain newspaper clippings concerning the activities of the American National Red Cross during World War I. The emphasis is on the work of the Glens Falls Chapter, but articles also describe the extensive work of the Red Cross during World War I in the region, the nation, and overseas, mainly to care for the sick and wounded soldiers. Local activities mentioned include fund raising, sewing and knitting, recruitment of nurses. Included are reports of the work of nurses in France, especially the work of Florence Bullard, a nurse from Glens Falls.

The Red Cross scrapbooks also provide some general background on World War I, describing soldiers from the Glens Falls area who participated, especially members of Company K, 105th Infantry Regiment, 27th Division, of the American Expeditionary Force. There are also patriotic articles urging local citizens to support the war effort. Following the war the emergency work of the Red Cross is explained, particularly during the influenza epidemic of 1918-1919. The compiler of the scrapbook may have been Laura S. Porter from Fort Edward, New York.
