servicemen and their military involvement during World War II, high school sports newspaper clippings, and memorabilia. There are also newspaper clippings of area high school sports. Included are photographs mostly of servicemen, a 1946 Glens Falls High School

graduation ceremony program, and poems.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Naomi Eleanor Guernsey was born 30 July 1928 in Glens Falls, a daughter of Loren Paul and Blanche I. Guernsey. She graduated from Glens Falls High School in 1946, following her older sisters who graduated in 1940, 1942 and 1944. Her yearbook entry says "Noni' is a gal who spends a lot of her time writing to and waiting for a guy named Ken. She's just the quiet kind whose nature never varies." What happened to "Ken" is unknown, but on 22 January 1949, Naomi married John F. Esmond.

SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

The scrapbook contains World War II newspaper clippings, high school sports newspaper clippings, and memorabilia. Newspaper clippings describe the involvement and service of many Glens Falls area residents during World War II. Also included are death notices of area soldiers who died in the war. What all these young men have in common (beyond their military service and, presumably their acquaintance with Naomi) is that they were notable high school athletes. There are also newspaper clippings of area high school sports teams – from Fort Edward, Hudson Falls, Glens Falls, South Glens Falls, and St. Mary's Academy (in Glens Falls). Included are photographs –

identified and unidentified, many of which are of young men who served overseas in World War II. Memorabilia include photographs, an admission ticket, advertisement card, business card, calling card, candy wrapper, cartoons, envelope, 1946 Glens Falls High School graduation ceremony program, and poems.

Naomi Guernsey added some information to the clippings in handwritten notes. For example, several clippings about soldiers have the note "disch," probably an abbreviation for discharge. Some photographs that may have had particular significance for Naomi Guernsey were mounted in the scrapbook and identified. However, most of the photographs and some memorabilia do not show evidence of being mounted and were probably placed loose between the pages of the scrapbook. Most of the loose photographs were of soldiers and contained names and dates. Some of the photographs from the soldiers contained notes by the soldier to Naomi Guernsey. Some items are no longer in the volume, either having fallen out or been removed. Several pages do not contain their original mountings.
