Abstract: George Satterlee (ca. 1850-1928) operated a traveling circus under

the name Sig. Sautelle. The Sautelle Circus Scrapbook contains newspaper clippings describing the tour of Sautelle's Circus in 1902. There are reports of visits of the circus to Glens Falls, as well as to other places in New York State, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Delaware, and Maryland. There are also a few clippings concerning the circus in later years, up to 1935, and

one Masonic certificate.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

George Satterlee was born, according to *Billboard*, on September 22, 1848, in Town of Luzerne, New York. His gravestone indicates 1850 as his year of birth. After starting out as a wagonmaker, Satterlee joined the Great North American Circus, adopting the name Sig. Sautelle. In the 1880's he was operating his own traveling circus, and by 1901 Sig. Sautelle's circus toured extensively by rail. He spent the winter months in Homer, New York. He retired to Glens Falls, where he died on June 21, 1928, and he is buried in Fort Edward, New York.

SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

The Sautelle's Circus Scrapbook contains newspaper clippings describing the tour of Sig. Sautelle's Circus in 1902. There are reports of visits of the circus to Glens Falls, as well as to other places in New York State, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Delaware, and Maryland. There are also a few clippings concerning the circus in later years, up to 1935.

One folder contains Satterlee's Masonic passport, identifying him as a 32nd degree Mason. It was issued to him on 5 April 1900, and was signed on the back by 33 33rd degree Masons at various Lodges Satterlee visited. The passport was donated to the library by Laura P. Slocum in June 1986, and was added to the Sautelle scrapbook collection.

A second folder holds xerographic copies of 8 photos (5 individual images) of Sautelle's Circus. The venue may be the Rensselaer County Fair, ca 1900. The original prints and glass plate negatives belong to Rachel Clothier, Corinth Town Historian, who loaned them to the Folklife Center. There are also scanned images of these photos on a disc in the folder.
