## SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

The scrapbook covers Harriette's senior year at Glens Falls High School, 1943-44. She was an honor student, involved in many activities at school, and enjoyed an active social life. The scrapbook contains programs for plays and concerts, ticket stubs, swizzle sticks, the ribbons from corsages, pictures of sports teams, clippings from the newspaper, etc. There are columns that Harriette herself wrote, for the *Post-Star* (newspaper, Glens Falls), about school and YMCA activities. Adding to the interest of the items themselves are Harriette's hand-written annotations: "Went with Mom and Dad" (to church). "went with Dorothy" to Albany, what they saw and what they ate, accompanying the bus ticket.

Harriette Whipple was featured in the 1944 *Look Magazine* series about Glens Falls called "Hometown USA."
