

# Sojourner Truth (1797–1883)

was born a slave named Isabella Baumfree, in Dutch speaking Swartekill, Ulster County. She changed her name to Sojourner Truth in 1843 based on a religious conviction to preach the Truth. Active in temperance, abolition, equal suffrage, and civil rights, she delivered her most famous speech at the 1851 Ohio Women's Rights Convention in Akron, OH. "I have... learned that Eve caused man to sin. Well, if woman upset the world, do give her a chance to set it right side up again."
