



Julia A. J. Foote (1823—1901)

was born in Schenectady, NY. She was the first woman deacon in the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church and preached on the Holiness movement. As a civil rights activist, she particularly advocated for women to be allowed, and encouraged to preach in public.
