

Eunice Newton Foote (1819–1888)

was one of the original signers of the Declaration of Sentiments at the Seneca Falls Convention in 1848, & helped prepare it for publication. Eunice was also one of the first to publish and present scientific findings of carbon dioxide and its effect on climate. She was also a painter, wife & mother. She lived in Saratoga Springs, NY from 1859-1865.
