

Lucy Norwood Phillips Allen (1851—1946)

Eleven years after New York granted women school suffrage, Lucy, along with Chloe Sisson, founded the Easton Political Equality Club, the first suffrage club in Washington County, New York. Lucy was also lead the county clubs as President of the Washington County Political Equality Club throughout the 1890s. After New York State women gained full suffrage in 1917, Lucy worked on Betty Wakeman Mitchell's campaign for New York State Assembly.
