



Lillian Pike Everest (1866—1951)

After returning from Colorado with her husband, Lillian was involved in Plattsburgh Suffrage from at least 1912 to 1917. An elocution and gymnastics teacher, she was a dynamic speaker. She founded the Plattsburgh Little Theatre, was a member of the Saranac Chapter NSDAR, and the Tuesday Club.
