



# Hannah Straight Lansing (1837—1916)

was called the “Mother of Clinton County Suffrage”. Active in abolition, temperance, and suffrage, she wrote for the *Plattsburgh Sentinel*. The 1855 Plattsburgh visit of Susan B. Anthony & Rev. Antoinette Brown converted her to the suffrage cause.
