

Hester C. Whitehurst Jeffrey (c.1842–1934)

was a suffragist & activist. After moving to Rochester, NY with her husband in 1891, Jeffrey joined the local Political Equality Club, Woman's Christian Temperance Union, and National Association of Colored Women. She founded the Susan B. Anthony Club & gave the eulogy at Susan B. Anthony's funeral in 1906. My favorite thing about Jeffrey is she was she belonged to the Needlework Guild of America! She probably would have raised a brow at my French knots on the bodice.
