



Kathryn Helene Starbuck (1887—1965)

served as Saratoga County Chair of the New York State Woman Suffrage Party from 1916-1918. A graduate of Vassar College in Poughkeepsie, NY during the Inez Milholland years, Starbuck also became a lawyer graduating from Albany Law School in 1914. She is best known for her 33 years at Skidmore College in Saratoga Springs, NY serving on the Board of Trustees, as Executive Secretary, and Professor.
