



Eleanor Weatherhead Higley (1872-1958)

was a founding member of the Political Equality Club of Hudson Falls serving as vice president in 1915, then president from 1916-1917. She also served as chairman of the 1915 Washington County Suffrage Convention. In 1916 she was elected secretary of the Washington County Branch of the New York State Woman Suffrage Party. She is buried in the Chester Rural Cemetery next to her husband, Brodie Gilman Higley.
