



Laura Schäfer Porter (1884—1966)

was an active member of the Fort Edward Political Equality Club & donated her suffrage materials to the Old Fort House museum in the 1960s. An artist, she studied with the likes of Weyman Adams, taught at three east coast colleges, exhibited at the Met, & pioneered occupational therapy with disabled veterans at Walter Reed Hospital. Upon returning home, she founded the Fort Edward Art Center & taught painting to locals.
