

Katherine Hulst Gavit

(1872—1964)

Katherine was born in Greenwich, NY and graduated from Syracuse University in 1896. While working as a clerk at the New York State Library in Albany, NY she met and married associate librarian Joseph Gavit. Katherine was Chairman for Publicity for the New York Woman's Suffrage Party and active in the Albany Equal Suffrage club. She continued to work for women's rights after New York women gained the right to vote in 1917.
