



Beulah Bailey Thull (1891–1975)

worked for suffrage in her 20s. After NYS women gained the vote in 1917, Thull became a founding member of the League of Women Voters of New York State. She became the first president of the League of Women Voters of Rensselaer County, NY, was state chair of the NYS Federation of Women's Club, Rensselaer County Historian, and a librarian. She also raced her Alfa Romeo at Watkins Glen!
