



Katherine Parker Howard Notman (1859—1946)

was appointed 11th campaign district chairman of the Empire State Campaign in 1913. The counties in her district included Rensselaer, Saratoga, Washington, Warren, and Essex. The Notman's summer home, Eaglestowe in Keene Valley (Essex County) was a hot spot for suffrage activity in the Adirondacks. Notman wrote articles for the Brooklyn Daily Eagle & Brooklyn Life during the campaign.
