



## Sarah Smith (1822—?)

was living at 410 Madison Avenue in Albany just below Lark Street when she was one of the first women to vote in the school elections of 1880. New York State had just extended limited suffrage to women. Sarah's husband, Joseph A. Smith, may have been the same J.A. Smith listed on a broadside advertising an event in Albany in 1863 to celebrate the Emancipation Proclamation.
