

C. Mary Douge Williams (1832–1884)

Mary was vice president of the integrated Albany County Woman Suffrage Association and led a group of women to register to vote in the 1880 school election, including her mother Susan Douge, and Sarah Smith. She was a teacher at the Wilberforce School in Albany, NY and died of tuberculosis in 1884.
