OVERVIEW OF THE RECORDS

- Abstract:** This collection consists of 10 records of the 22nd Regiment Infantry Volunteers and 1 from the 153rd Regiment. Most of the documents list volunteers from Glens Falls, NY and surrounding areas. Included are two "Morning Reports" sheets from the 22nd Regiment for the months of July and August 1861, as well as 7 muster rolls for the 22nd Reg., dated 1861. The provenance of the collection is unknown, though Dr. Austin Wells Holden (1819-1891), whose son, James, started the special collections here at Crandall Public Library, was the first citizen of Warren County to volunteer. He was an organizer of the 22nd, Captain of Co. F, and assistant surgeon.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Captain George Clendon Jr. (1827-1908) was born in England and moved to Glens Falls, NY in 1848, where he ran the Phoenix Drug Store on Glen St. and a soap factory. He was wounded at the 2nd Battle of Bull Run. He was part of the "Iron Brigade".

SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE RECORDS

This collection includes Civil War records for the 22nd Regiment Infantry Volunteers of New York State. Most of these volunteers were from Glens Falls, NY, Warrensburg, NY and surrounding towns. The records include seven muster rolls for infantry volunteers of the 22nd Regiment (Folder 1). The Muster rolls were taken on June 6, 1861, July 20/22, 1861, July 25, 1861, July 26, 1861, July 25/26, 1861 and November 14, 1861. They were overseen by Col. Walter Phelps Jr.

The remaining documents (Folder 2) include two morning reports and a casualty report for the 22nd Regiment, as well as enlistment papers for the 153rd Regiment, which included many citizens of Warrensburg, NY, Glens Falls, NY, and surrounding areas. The morning reports were made for the months of July 1861 and August 1861. They were overseen by Captain George Clendon Jr., Colonel Walter Phelps Jr., and George Wetmore. The casualty report lists the dead and wounded volunteers from two battles: the battle of South Mountain on Sept. 14, 1862 and the battle of Sharpsburg, MD, on Sept. 17, 1862.

Also included (Folder 3) is the official program for the First Annual Reunion, 1888.

The collector of these records is unknown, though Dr. Austin Wells Holden (1819-1891), whose son, James, started the special collections at Crandall Public Library, was the first citizen of Warren County to volunteer. He was an organizer of the 22nd Regiment, Captain of Co. F, and assistant surgeon.
